



SchoolOne Presents Case Study to Catholic Educators at Annual Meeting

“21st Century Diocesan Information System: A Case Study in Progress” was the topic of a presentation given by SchoolOne President Bob Longo and Vice President Henry Patel during the recent Chief Administrators of Catholic Education (CACE) annual meeting in October. SchoolOne made the presentation as part of its role as a corporate partner to CACE, which is a department of the National Catholic Education Association.

The presentation focused on a project SchoolOne is undertaking with over 50 Catholic Schools in the California Bay Area. “One of the most exciting aspects of this project is the data analytics abilities these schools will have. For the first time, schools will be capable of viewing and analyzing data that will enable schools to raise student and teacher performance and maximize investment to focus on areas that will have the most impact,” said Longo.
